

American Singer Standards – Adopted in 1943

Bird $5\frac{3}{4}$ inches long measured either from top of head to tip of tail, or tip of beak to tip of tail.

Angle of Bird when not singing, between 34 to 45 degrees from vertical. Should not have the roller hoop when it stands in position when it sings.

Head – Rounded, not too much dome

Beak – Medium

Eye – Round, well set

Neck and Throat – Full song expansion

Carriage – Lively, alert, fearless

Shoulder – Pronounced

Back – Rounded, not too flat

Wings – Medium

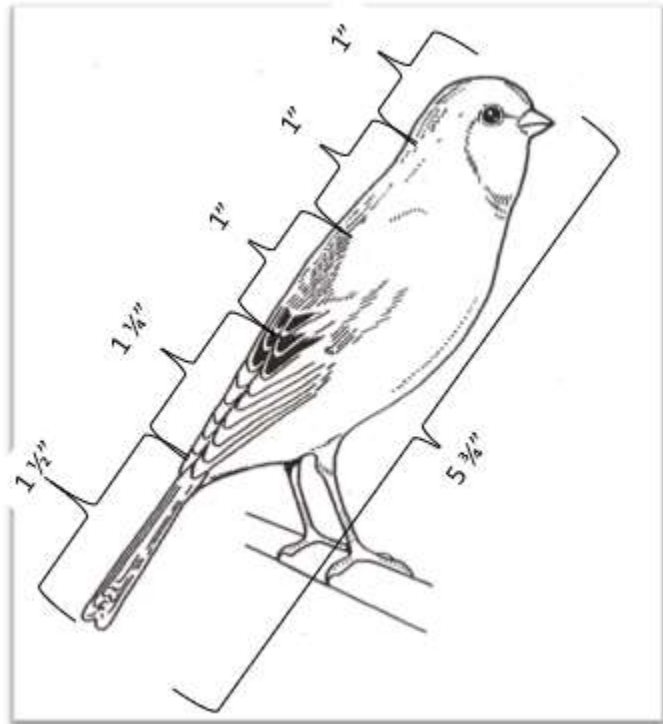
Breast – Rounded and full

Thigh – Not much showing

Legs – Medium

Tail – Medium, close

Feathers - tight



100 Point Show Score System

Points	Characteristic
10	Freedom (one point each time bird sings in first 10 minutes, 10 maximum)
60	Rendition (quality of song)
20	Conformation (as compared to the Standard)
10	Condition (health, vigor, cleanliness of bird and cage)
